P - Proud of Achieving

- 4. Keep your workstations and learning lab clean and leave equipment the way you found it. Please push chairs back under desk as you leave the classroom.

O - Organizing for Success

- 1. Absent from Class & Late Assignments

If you turn in work late work, school wide policy:

ZGTMMS EXCEL Classroom Process 2018-19

In our ZGTMMS classes, students will be expected to learn, follow and be part of our EXCEL Processes.

E = ENGAGE - Meet and greet

*Each day students will be greeted with a handshake and a positive affirmation by the teacher and other classmates.

X = EXPLORE - Discovering the individual's needs

*Each day students will share a "good thing" with one another in the classroom.

C = COMMUNICATE - Make the message relevant and show that we care

- *Teachers & students will look for connections to lessons so lessons are relevant to real life skills/needs.
- *Teachers & students look for ways to truly care about others in their classroom. GIVE AFFIRMATIONS!
- * Teachers & students are aware that their body language is 55%, tone of voice is 38% and actual words said are only the 7% of what they are communicating to others.
- * When listening to others teachers and students will practice "SOLER"

E = EMPOWER - My teaching become their learning

- *Students will create, agree to and sign a social contract (Effort, No put downs, Active Listening) for how they are to treat others and be treated by their classmates in the classroom.
- *Students will be able to choose a classroom duty to help facilitate leadership in the classroom.
- *Students are to initiate and follow the signals which keep our class environment running smoothly so all students can learn and excel in the classroom.

<u>Check</u> = classmate not following social contract

Foul = something negative said to a student by a classmate - classmate will say 2 positives comments for each negative comment

<u>Time out</u> = all students should stop talking.

*If student's behavior is not in line with the social contract, teacher will ask "4 questions", before giving consequences which will allow student to correct behavior.

L = LAUNCH - Meaningful ending

- *Class will end with a review of material learned.
- *Students will commit to task or behavior.
- *Teacher will end the class with a passionate quote, video, or send off to close out the class period.
