Tour the WCPSS Early Colleges - Early Colleges allow students to earn high school credits, as well as free college credits. In WCPSS students earn free, transferable community college credits as well as a certification from Wake Tech Community College. Students can explore a career while in high school, as well as complete an internship and graduate with work experience.

Learn about Career Academies - The academy is a smaller learning community that focuses on a career theme and is integrated into students' studies including their core curriculum courses. Each year the same group (cohort) of academy students takes a Career and Technical Education course aligned with the career theme, as well as one or more core classes together. This school-within-a-school model may be either a three-or-four-year academy. Each academy student participates in several work-based learning activities such as job shadowing, career fairs, career themed industry tours and an internship of 135 hrs between their jr. and senior year. Academy students are prepared to participate in these experiences through their cohort academy courses.

Take college classes at your high school through College and Career Promise

What can it mean for you! An opportunity to start earning a two-or four-year degree, a certificate or diploma in a field of your choice! The Career & College Promise program offers qualified high-school-age students in North Carolina the opportunity to study and practice their skills tuition free, while they are still in high school, This allows students to get a jumpstart on their workplace and college preparation while attending high school.



TEEN EMPLOYMENT LAWS

Minimum Wage & Overtime \$7.25 (starting July 24, 2009)

Overtime Premium for hours over 40 per workweek based on regular rate of pay. Determined on workweek basis. Must be paid within the pay period earned.

Minimum Age Standards

18 Year Olds: No longer subject to the Child Labor - youth employment provisions

16 – 17 Year Olds: May be employed in any occupation other than those declared hazardous or detrimental

14 – 15 Year Olds: May be employed in Limited Occupations outside school hours

Under 14: No employment in non-agricultural occupations. Some exemptions for work with parents, actors or performers

Minors between the ages of 14 and 15 may be employed:

- Outside of school hours;
- Not more than three hours a day on school days;
- Not more than eight hours a day on non-school days;
- Not more than 18 hours in any school week;
- Not more than 40 hours in any non-school week; and
- Only between the hours of 7am and 7pm except from June 1 through Labor Day, during which time their work may end no later than 9 p.m

Youth Employment Youth Employment Certificates (Work Permits)

Can be issued on-line: Applies to ALL youth under age 18 except government and agricultural workers Must be obtained prior to first day of work Valid for one specific employer

Job Limitations (All Youth Under 18 Years of Age) No

youth under age 18 may perform any job that has been declared be hazardous (by Federal law) or detrimental (by North Carolina Law)

PERMITTED OCCUPATIONS 14-15 year olds

-Office or Clerical Work

-Work of an Intellectual or Artistically Creative Nature

-Cooking with Electric or Gas Grills (No Open Flame)- deep fat fryers that are equipped with and utilize devices that automatically lower and raise the baskets into and out of the oil or grease.

-Cashiering, Selling, Modeling, Art Work, Work in Advertising

- Departments, Window Trimming or Comparative Shopping

-Price Marking and Tagging by Hand, Assembling Orders, Packing and Shelving -Bagging and Carrying Out Customers' Orders

-Errand and Delivery Work by Foot, Bicycle or Public Transportation

-Clean Up Work (Not Including Power-Driven Mowers, Cutters, Trimmers, Edgers, or Similar Equipment)

-Kitchen Work and Other Work Involved in Preparing and Serving Food and Beverages

-Cleaning Fruits and Vegetables

-Loading and Unloading of Light, Non-power Driven Tools and Personal Protective Equipment that the Minor Uses, onto Motor Vehicles

-Lifeguards (15-Year Olds ONLY)

If the job is not specifically PERMITTED for 14-15 year olds, it is prohibited
